CVA opens "Midwest Seasons" exhibition

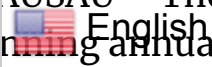

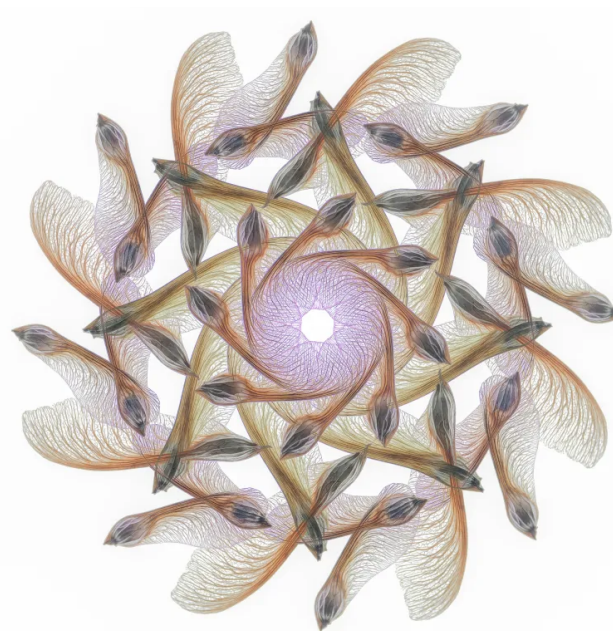
CVA's 32nd annual "Midwest Seasons," untitled, by Hannah Jo Malaczynski. Photo courtesy CVA.

WAUSAU – The Center for the Visual Arts has opened its longest running annual juried exhibit, “Midwest Seasons.”



This show will run until March 5 at 427 N. Fourth St. in downtown Wausau.

Now in its 32nd year, "Midwest Seasons" features artists from all over the country who propose pieces that capture the spirit of the Midwest and its seasonal wonders. This year's juror is Melissa Airy, an accomplished artist and educator working at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point where she teaches new and emerging art methods and media.

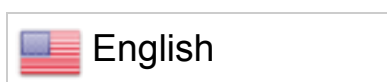

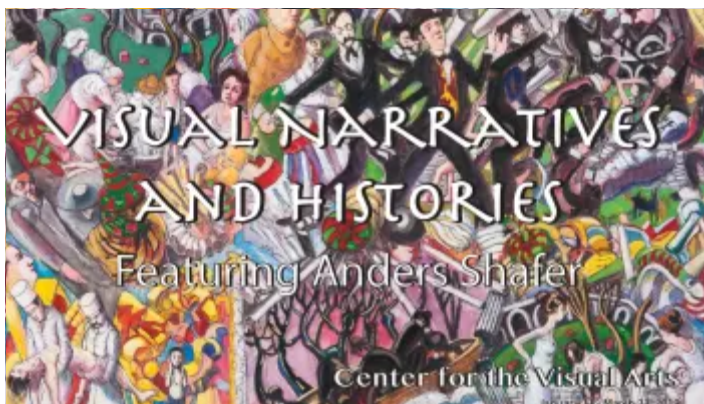
