Amos' work has been in numerous exhibitions at galleries and museums. Over 6,000 homes get to experience his love imbued in print daily. His work is in collections such as the Newberry Library and the Library of Congress.

The last time our city experienced his practice was 1979. Join us in welcoming Amos back to our community, where he once lived and where his son was born at a birth center that once existed in our neighborhood.
