Akron Art Museum presents GLOW: Neon & Light

On View from September 21, 2024 – February 9, 2025

Akron, OH: *GLOW: Neon & Light* will open at the Akron Art Museum in the Karl and Bertl Arnstein Galleries on Saturday, September 21, 2024. This group exhibition will feature works created with analog materials like glass, mirrors, light bulbs, and neon tubes. Over twenty spectacular and immersive works will cover the galleries, creating a beautiful array

Rather than text-based artworks typically associated with neon, this exhibition will feature sculptural installations with three dimensional explorations of lights. Visitors will learn more about light's scientific properties, including the different chemical elements—like neon and argon—that illuminate when inserted into electrified glass tubes.

Although every work of art in the show will include an element of light, the conceptual ideas and visual styles will range from minimalist to maximalist. Some artists in the exhibition juxtapose lights with different materials, like wood, fractured glass, mirrors, and even the interiors of VHS tape cassettes. Some bend their own glass to create neon objects, some work with special manufacturers, and others recycle commercial neon and found objects.

"We are very excited to present an exciting artistic medium like neon and light to the galleries." Says CEO Jon Fiume. "This exhibition invites our visitors to explore and immerse themselves in the intersection of art, science, and perception. It reflects our commitment to presenting innovative and thought-provoking art that not only illuminates our galleries but also sparks curiosity and conversation."

"I curated GLOW with a few questions I wanted to explore: how are artists creating three-dimensional sculptures using light? How does light interact and play in physical space? How does light engage with time? What are the kinds of sensory experiences that visitors can have in our space?" Says Curator Wendy Earle who curated the show. "In thinking about these questions and talking with artists who use neon and light as the basis of their artistic practice, I think we've created a special show that really is a love letter to the medium of neon. Come see the light, hear the buzz of the electricity, and feel the warmth (but don't touch the art!)."
