About the Artist:

Sondra L. Jonson of S.L. Jonson Studios began planning her career in art at the age of 5. Her studio, established in 1985, has produced a large line of sculptures, from miniatures to monuments for clients throughout the United States and in Europe. Jonson, a Magna Cum Laude graduate of Bryn Mawr College, and a former student of EvAngelos Frudakis, has developed a signature style which is both classical and contemporary, powerful yet tender, always sensitive to form, color and message. Now in her 27th years as a professional sculptor, Ms. Jonson has established her reputation as a master of human figure and portraiture.

About the Sculpture:

My vision for the artwork took shape when I read these words of Scripture: "He will swallow up death in victory, and the Lord God will wipe away tears from off all faces" (Is 25:8) "... and this mortal shall have put on immortality" (1 Cor. 15:4)

At first glance, this artwork illustrates the last journey of one of America's finest sons. Although the figure carrying the fallen soldier to Heaven is angelic, she is also the symbol of God's great love and mighty power – power that conquers even death.

About SculptureTour Salina:

SculptureTour Salina (STS) is an annual juried competition and exhibition in Salina, Kansas. An extraordinary community filled with cultural organizations and venues of national acclaim. The exhibition is open to all artists creating works suitable for outdoor display. Approximately 20 sculptures are selected and carefully sited in historic downtown Salina. Sculptures remain installed for one year providing both viewing enjoyment to community and visitors as well as a sales opportunity for participating artists. \$6,250 in Juror's Merit Awards are presented annually and to date, more than 40 sculptures have been purchased or donated. Each year, the City of Salina designates \$20,000 toward the purchase of the People's Choice winner. The sculpture is then installed in a public environment within the community.
