The event will feature the iconic National Park posters from The Fifty-Nine Parks Print Series, as well as select gig-posters and art prints from The National Poster Retrospecticus. Fifty-Nine Parks is also debuting their new children’s book *Animals of The National Parks* that is published by Random House. A special feature of the Lawrence event is a selection of artwork by local artist Mary Gage and her *Parks and Green Spaces* series. All prints and books are for sale. The event is all-ages and open to the public.
