Butch Murphy and Aaron Dougherty work with modernist realism, and Luke Ball investigates language in decaying architecture.

Kansas City, MO — This October, the Kansas City Artists Coalition (KCAC) presents *Prairie Ubiquitous*, A two person show with Butch Murphy and Aaron Dougherty in its Main Gallery, and in the Snap Space Gallery, Luke Ball presents a collection of prints and paper cuts that imagine the overlooked corners of the American landscape in his solo show *Reliquary*.

Main Gallery: Prairie Ubiquitous By Butch Murphy and Aaron Dougherty

Butch Murphy is a metal sculptor, creator, fabricator and installer, autodidact by training. His creations are made from repurposed and new carbon steel using only hand tools. From His Statement: "My evolution can best be categorized in three phases: **Realism**, using found metal junk, **Layering**, and finally **Modernism**. Each production is a study, never expecting perfection, as that would eliminate the search, and for me, the end.

Aaron Dougherty is a registered architect, and photographer based in Kansas Clty, MO. His body of work seeks to highlight the mundane. About photographing grain silos, Dougherty writes: "These grand and dignified structures are all over the place here in our Kansas City back yard— so to speak. And yet it was only recently that it occurred to me to photograph them...Though I've worked a lot of years to separate 'subject' from 'image captured', some 'meaning' has crept into these."

Snap Space Gallery: Reliquary, by Luke Ball

"Reliquary" is a collection of prints and paper cuts that imagine the overlooked corners of the American landscape—abandoned places and rusted signs that speak in fragments of hope, humor, and despair.
